

Ashford Park Primary School Remote Learning Plan

Due to the continued situation with Covid cases in school, we have reviewed the APPS Remote Learning Plan so that where possible, children can continue with their education with minimal interruptions as possible.

This meets the expectations set out in the government guidance Remote Education Good Practice

Ashford Park Primary School will use Google Classroom for remote learning for years 1 to 6 including those in The Acorn Centre, Seesaw will be the online learning platform for children in reception classes.

If a child does not have access to a computer, laptop, tablet or the internet, the school will do all it can to provide the family with the necessary technology. We now have a store of devices ready to be borrowed by families who require them during periods of isolation.

Please make sure that you make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

How do I access my children's learning?

You will find below an overview of lessons to be completed each day. When you access Google Classroom or Seesaw, you will find all of the assignments that your teacher would like you to complete. You should complete the activities daily and once completed, on Google Classroom, click on the 'Turn It In' button, along with a photograph of the completed work and on Seesaw add a response along with a photograph of the completed work. If there is an issue with gaining access to the learning on either platform, please email your class teacher via the main school email address.

What are the remote learning expectations for my child?

EYFS Reception Classes

Daily:

- Phonics Using the Little Wandle YouTube videos allocated on the Seeesaw platform
- Reading Using the Bug Club on line scheme Collins E Books

Weekly:

- Maths White Rose Maths and NCETM (Early Adopters Framework) using the work set on Seesaw
- English Using the work set on Seesaw
- Creative Weekly Seesaw tasks based on our Imaginative Learning Project
- PE Cosmic Yoga or another online platform as indicated on Seesaw

Please note that 2 weeks of lessons will remain on Seesaw so that your child has sufficient work to complete during their absence

Years 1 to 6

The daily lessons allocated on **Google Classroom** will include:

- Maths
- Writing
- Phonics Using the Little Wandle YouTube videos allocated on Google Classroom (unless specified, these will be for KS1 only)
- One lesson from the broader curriculum will be set daily e.g. music, PSHE, RE, computing or a lesson linked to the Imaginative Learning Project with a focus on science, history or geography, French or Spanish lessons may be set for children in KS2
- PE challenges or ideas will be uploaded to keep your child active
- The rest of the school day will be time for your child to continue their learning via the education apps they are familiar with during 'normal' times to support with learning of key knowledge and skills such as Bug Club for online reading books and accompanying comprehensions, Spelling Shed, Maths Shed, TT Rockstars and Mathletics

Acorn Centre – Bumblebee and Butterfly Classes

The daily lessons on **Google Classroom** will include:

- Maths
- English
- Makaton Sign of the Week
- The rest of the school day will be time for your child to continue their learning via the education apps they are familiar with during 'normal' times to support with learning of key knowledge and skills such as Bug Club for online reading books and accompanying comprehensions, Maths Shed and TT Rockstars
- Lessons from the broader curriculum will be set daily by your child's mainstream class teacher e.g. music, PSHE, RE, computing or a lesson linked to the Imaginative Learning Project with a focus on science, history or geography.

How does my child submit their work and will they receive feedback?

- Children should submit all requested pieces of work via Google Classroom or Seesaw.
- This can be done by clicking on the 'Turn it in' on Google Classroom or '+Response' button on Seesaw.
- Your child will know that their teacher has read their work once it has been returned to them on Google Classroom but teachers are not expected to provide written feedback.
- During short periods of self-isolation, usual attendance procedures will apply. Therefore, there will not be live check-ins.
