Living things and their habitats

- 1. Go for a wander around your garden, local park or local area. See if you can spot any wildlife birds, insects, mammals and take a photo of it. Then research your animal (you could visit your library or the website Nat Geo Kids). Write a fact sheet about your animal and include information about their: appearance, habitat, diet, behaviours, predators or prey. Remember to include pictures or drawings!
- 2. Create a biome (habitat) either in 3D using craft materials or by drawing a picture. Perhaps you can include some of the animals or wildlife that live there.

- 3. Choose an Eastern European country and turn its name into some Word Art! Write out the name of the country in large, colourful lettering. You could use the colours of your chosen country's flag in your design. You could even incorporate famous landmarks or buildings in your design.
- 4. Design a map of Eastern Europe. Include: countries, capital cities, other major cities, any nearby seas, any other important information like rivers, lakes or mountain ranges.

5. Choose a flower from your garden or the local park to sketch in detail. Can you then draw the same flower using another medium such as watercolours, pastels or oil pastels?
