**Shrinitha in Moorhen for an excellent attitude to learning in Spanish and trying her best.**

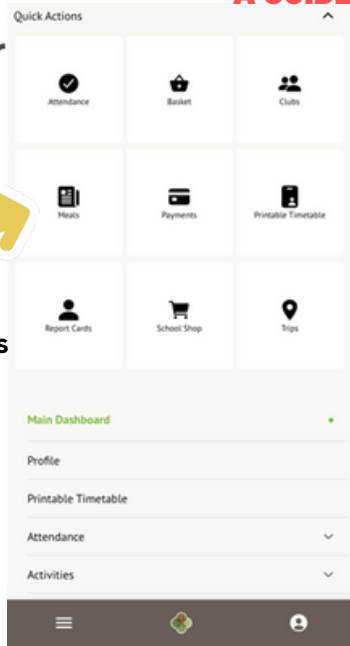

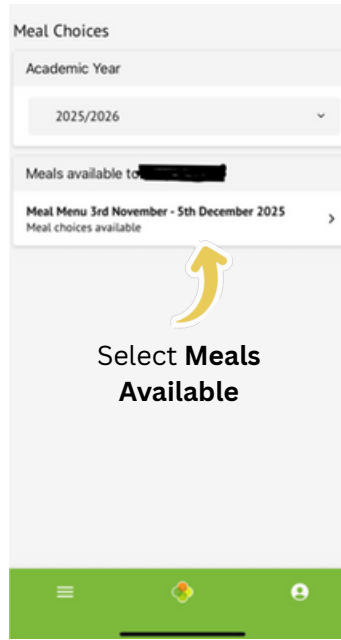

## A GUIDE ON HOW TO ORDER USING THE ARBOR APP

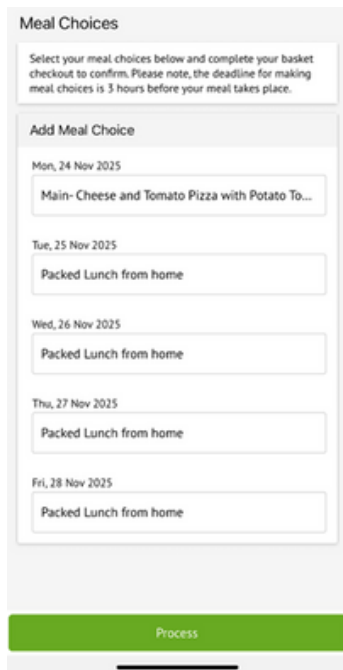
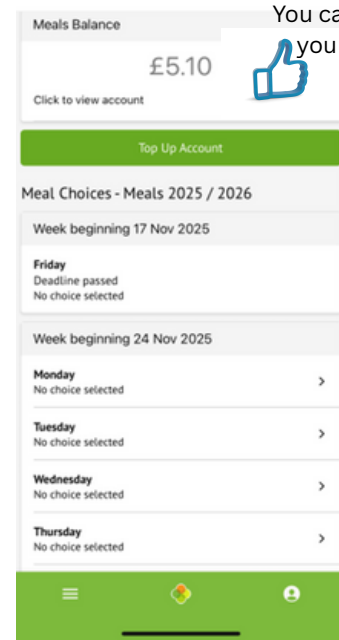
Please Note- You can only order if you are in credit



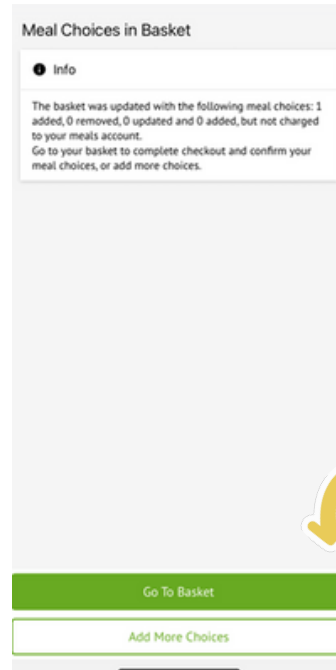
Select **Meals** from the main dashboard

**Please ensure that your child's lunch options are selected in Arbor.**

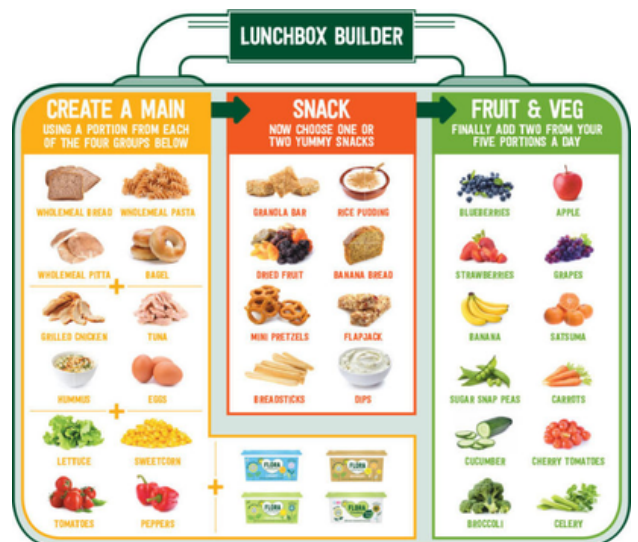
If your child has packed lunches, please add this.
