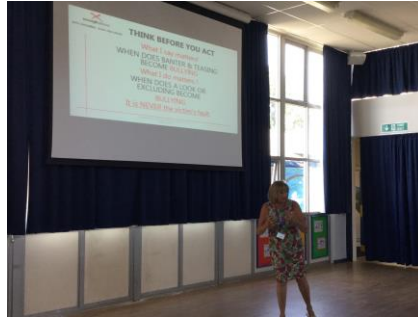




Safeguarding Hotspot

John Muir Conserve Day
