We were allowed to go into the Chapel after the wedding. We walked down the aisle and saw where the Queen and

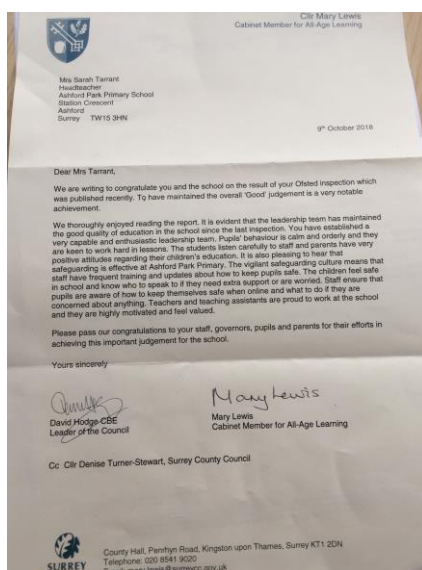
Prince Charles were sitting.
