

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

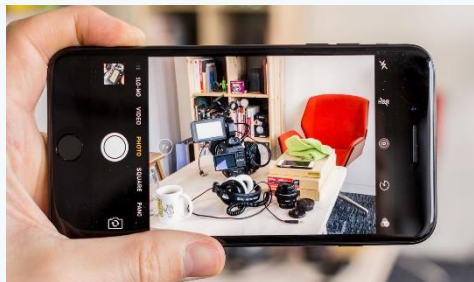

Take a photo and submit it, so you can check it works for you.

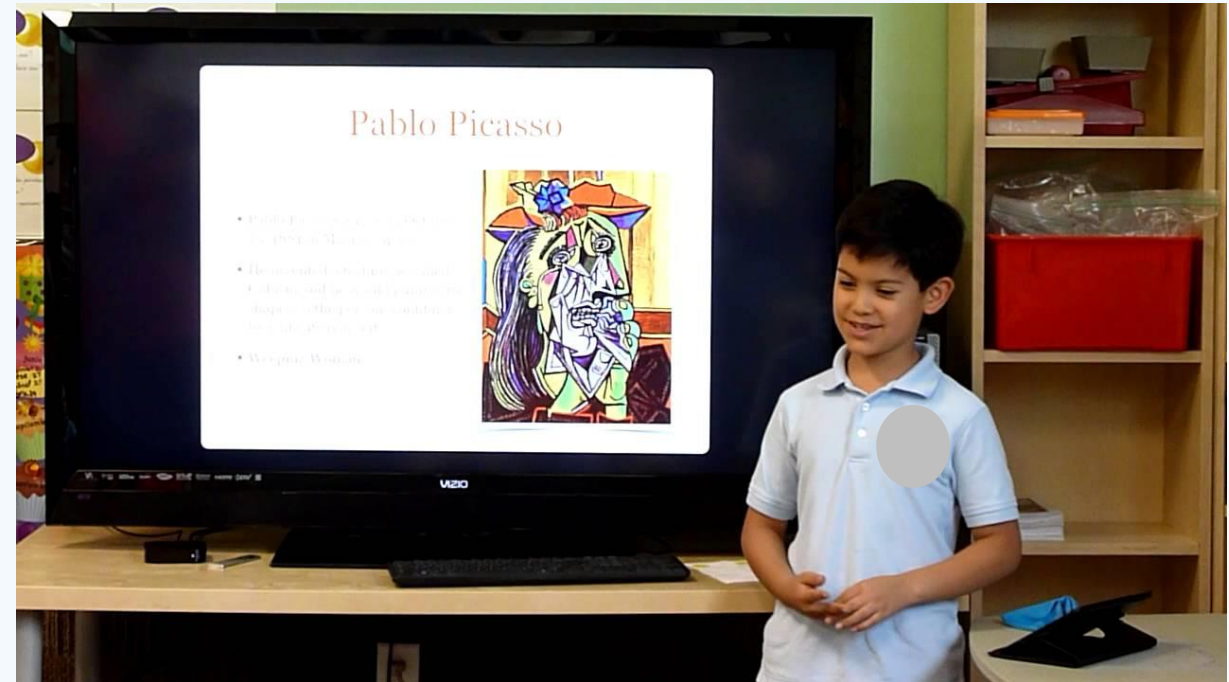
