Approximately 33% of our children have been educated in school, with their parents employed as 'Critical workers to the Covid response', with our remaining and the majority of our parents / carers, magically combining their working day with their children's remote educational provision!

Half term and INSET day

Nationally schools will be fully closed over the half term holiday and INSET days will be honoured. For the large number of children who have been attending school, their last day will be on **Thursday**, **11th February**. In addition to this, learning on Google Classroom will stop on this day and resume on **Monday 22**nd **February**.

Our plans for staff training day on Friday, when the school is closed to the children, will include an opportunity for staff to receive virtual update training with a specific focus on preparing APPS children to be successful, informed, well-rounded citizens of the future; ensuring our children's entitlement to a rich, diverse, broad and balanced curriculum. Learning support assistant colleagues will be receiving training on '*Targeted Mental Health Training in Schools'* (TAMHS).

From 1st to 7th February, we have been raising awareness on how to support our children with their mental health through #DressToExpress and <u>Children's Mental Health Week</u>.
